MATERIALS:

1-2/3 yards Blender Cut Grass
1 yard Blender Earth
3/8 yard Landmarks Blue
3/8 yard Farmlands
3/8 yard Iowa's Best Ivory
3/8 yard Iconic Iowa
1/4 yard Blender Limoncello
1-1/2 yard Blender Chambray, includes Binding
3/4 yard Blender Navy
4 yards Blender Chambray, Backing

READ THROUGH ALL INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE BEGINNING. SEW PIECES RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER AND USE A 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE THROUGHOUT UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED. WOF - WIDTH OF FABRIC; RST - RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER

CUTTING:

From Blender Cut Grass Fabric:

Cut [6] – 1-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [4] strips

Subcut [4] – 1-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(A)**

Cut [2] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips **(A2)**

Cut [8] – 4-1/2" × WOF strips, Outer Border

From Blender Earth Fabric:

Cut [6] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [4] strips

Subcut [4] – 5-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(B)**

From Landmarks Blue Fabric:

Cut [2] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [1] strip

Subcut [1] – 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(C)**

From Farmlands Fabric:

Cut [2] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [1] strip

Subcut [1] – 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(D)**

From Iowa's Best Ivory Fabric:

Cut [2] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [1] strip

Subcut [1] – 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(E)**

From Iconic Iowa Fabric:

Cut [2] – 5-1/2" × WOF strips. Set aside [1] strip

Subcut [1] – 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(F)**

From Blender Limoncello Fabric:

Cut [1] – 1-1/2" × WOF strip **(G)**

Cut [1] – 2" × WOF strips

Subcut [9] – 2" squares, Cornerstones

From Blender Chambray Fabric:

Cut [8] – 2" × WOF strips

Subcut [24] – 2" × 11-1/2" strips, sashing

Cut [6] – 2" × WOF strips, Inner Border

Cut [8] – 2-1/2" × WOF strips, Binding

From Blender Navy Fabric:

Cut [7] – 3-1/2" × WOF strips, Middle Border

From Blender Cut Grass Fabric:

Cut [8] – 4-1/4" × WOF strips, Outer Border

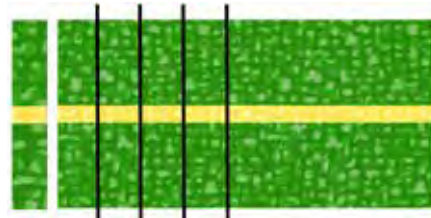
From Blender Chambray Fabric:

Cut [2] – 72" × WOF strips, Label Backing

BLOCK ASSEMBLY:

Strip Sets:

1. Sew [1] Blender Limoncello 1-1/2" × WOF strip **(G)** in between [2] Blender Cut Grass 5-1/2" × WOF strips **(A2)** Press all seams toward Blender Limoncello.
2. Subcut into [16] – 1-1/2" × 11-1/2" Units. Label as **(AA)**.



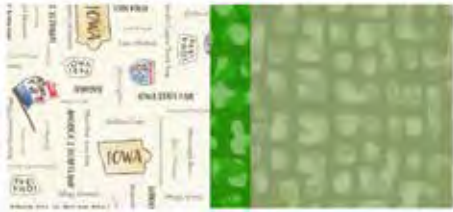
3. Sew [1] Landmarks Blue 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(C)**, [1] Blender Cut Grass 1-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(A)** and Blender Earth 5-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(B)** as shown. Press all seams toward Blender Cut Grass. Repeat with WOF strips.
4. Subcut into [8] – 5-1/2" × 11-1/2" Units. Label as **(CC)**.



- Sew [1] Farmlands 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(D)**, [1] Blender Cut Grass 1-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(A)** and Blender Earth 5-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(B)** as shown. Press all seams toward Blender Cut Grass. Repeat with WOF strips.
- Subcut into [8] - 5-1/2" × 11-1/2" Units. Label as **(DD)**.



- Sew [1] Iowa's Best Ivory 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(E)**, [1] Blender Cut Grass 1-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(A)** and Blender Earth 5-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(B)** as shown. Press all seams toward Blender Cut Grass. Repeat with WOF strips.
- Subcut into [8] - 5-1/2" × 11-1/2" Units. Label as **(EE)**.



- Sew [1] Iconic Iowa 5-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(F)**, [1] Blender Cut Grass 1-1/2" × 18" rectangle **(A)** and Blender Earth 5-1/2" × 18" rectangles **(B)** as shown. Press all seams toward Blender Cut Grass. Repeat with WOF strips.
- Subcut into [8] - 5-1/2" × 11-1/2" Units. Label as **(FF)**.



Block Assembly:

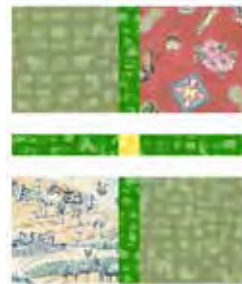
- Sew together the following strip set units: **(CC)**, **(AA)** and **(DD)**. Block measures 11-1/2" square. Press seams either way. Make [4]. Label (Blue/Farmland)



- Sew together the following strip set units: **(CC)**, **(AA)** and **(EE)**. Block measures 11-1/2" square. Press seams either way. Make [4]. Label (Blue/Iowa's Best)



- Sew together the following strip set units: **(FF)**, **(AA)** and **(DD)**. Block measures 11-1/2" square. Press seams either way. Make [4]. Label (Red/Farmland)

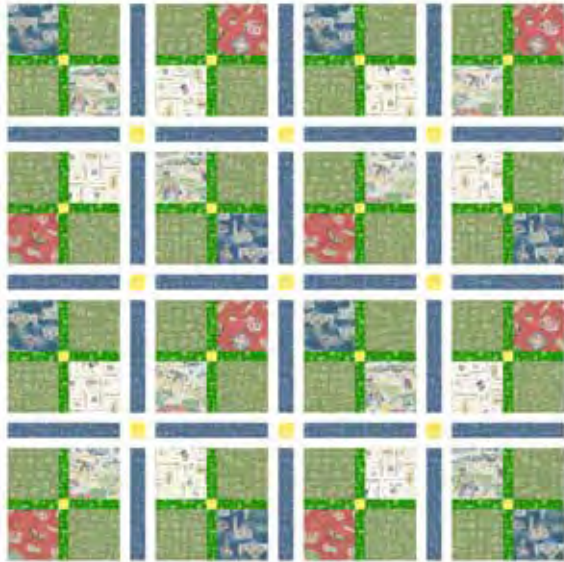


- Sew together the following strip set units: **(FF)**, **(AA)** and **(EE)**. Block measures 11-1/2" square. Press seams either way. Make [4]. Label (Red/Iowa's Best)



QUILT ASSEMBLY:

1. Assemble quilt top center with sashing and cornerstones as shown in the diagram:
2. Sew neighboring blocks together to create each row. Press.
3. Sew rows together to create the main design. Press.



face down, match up the [2] center marks and secure with a couple of pins. Now match up the end of the borders with the corner of the quilt, secure with a couple of pins. Pin the border evenly across the quilt.

5. Stitch each side border to the quilt. Press toward the border.

Middle Border

1. Repeat Steps 1-5 for Inner Border, using Blender Navy strips.

Outer Border

1. Repeat Steps 1-5 for Inner Border, using Blender Cut Grass strips.



BORDER ASSEMBLY:

Inner Border

1. Sew all Blender Chambray strips RST, short end to short end, to make [1] long strip. Press all the seams to [1] side.
2. For the side borders, measure from the top of the quilt to the bottom. Take [3] measurements. Measure a couple of inches in from each side and down the middle.
3. If your shortest measurement is greater than 1/2" from your longest measurement, then it is better to see if you can adjust a seam or two to help get the measurements closer. Once you are happy with your measurements. Find the average of the measurements and use that number to cut [2] border strips that length.
4. Fold the border strip in half and mark center with a pin. Fold your quilt in half to find the center of your two sides, mark with a pin. With the quilt facing up, lay the border fabric

FINISHING:

1. Layer quilt top with batting and backing.
2. Quilt with your favorite pattern or take it to your Favorite Long Arm Quilter.
3. Bind.
4. Label and Enjoy!
